Custom Classic Corvette Club Rules and Standards

1. Custom Classic Corvette Club membership is open to all Chevrolet Corvette owners per club bylaws.
2. All club vehicles are expected to be maintained to the highest level of detail possible. Remember, wherever we may go, we're representing the reputation of CCCC.
3. Monthly Members Business Meetings are mandatory. Meetings are held on the last Thursday of each month from 6pm for board members 6:30 pm – 7:30pm for General members. Meetings will consist of club business and other topics that are deemed necessary for CCCC to function.
4. In addition to mandatory Monthly Members Business Meetings, each member is required to enter a minimum of (2) events and (4) club functions (cruises, cookouts, etc.) annually. When not entering an event, members are expected to assist with the event. Club participation is highly encouraged and plays a major role in the perception of the club.
5. Club events and social gatherings will be approved and scheduled by the Board Members. Spouses, significant others, and family members are welcome to attend all CCCC events and functions. Members and their guests are expected to conduct themselves appropriately at all times when representing CCCC.
6. In the event both President and Vice President cannot attend the same event, the President will appoint the club Secretary to oversee the event.
7. Membership Applicants MUST undergo a 90-day probationary period. This serves a two-fold purpose: 1) It allows the applicant ample time to determine if the club meets the applicant's expectations. 2) It allows current members ample time to assess the applicant's dedication and personality. All applicants are highly encouraged to attend meetings and club functions during the probation period. It is important that we uphold this rule in order to get to know a prospective member. Following the probation period, Members will conduct a formal vote to accept an Applicant for membership per CCCC's bylaws. Upon acceptance, Rules #3 and #4 will also apply.
8. As a Member of CCCC, you are required to pay annual dues that will contribute to such things as club website, decals, and other necessary club-related supplies. Also, membership will entitle Members to club discounts where applicable.
9. Member's vehicles must remain legally registered, insured, and in safe operating condition.
10. Members must abide by State, Local, and Federal laws and regulations.
11. Members must not use or possess alcohol, illegal drugs, weapons, or any other illegal item at club functions.
12. Members must not use profane language, gestures, or other insulting behavior during any club function.
